Big Question

Can every wrong thing be forgiven?

Big Game: Heads down, thumbs up!

Choose three (can be less if required) people to stand at the front then the rest sit with their heads down, eyes closed but stick their thumbs up. The three at the front then go around and choose one person and squeeze their thumb. Then the three who had their thumbs squeezed stand up and have to guess which person squeezed their thumb. If they guess correctly they swap places. If they don't they stay where they are and repeat!

Memory Verse : write the bible verse on individual post it notes and see if the children can put it in order.

Luke 5: 20 "When Jesus saw their faith, he said, 'Friend, your sins are forgiven.'"

Big Read

To be forgiven means that you have to come to Jesus, realising that he paid the price on the cross for the wrong things you've done. Then you say to him that you are sorry - and mean it- and promise that with his power, you won't do whatever you did wrong again.

A really helpful thing the Bible says is that if we say we are sorry to God and really mean it, he will completely forget what we did wrong and never remember it again.

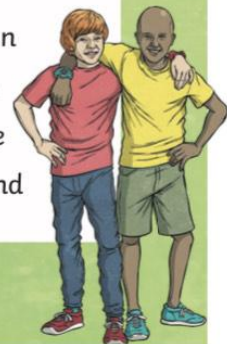
